Carroll A. Watkins Ali, Ph.D.

Dr. Carroll Watkins Ali is a pastoral/public theologian/psychologist. Her seminal text in womanist pastoral theology, Survival and Liberation: Pastoral Theology in African American Context, is a widely used text throughout the country. Currently, Dr. Watkins Ali is the executive director of Greater Denver Interfaith Alliance, which is a nonprofit organization serving the needs of the Black community of Denver/Aurora, primarily. Dr. Watkins Ali is also the founder and CEO of Watkins Ali & Associates, which is a consulting firm, and a practicing psychotherapist. She is an active member of the Northeast Park Hill Neighborhood Coalition and co-founding member of the Black Community Health Awareness and Response Team (BCHART) of the Colorado Black Health Collaborative. On the national level, Dr. Watkins Ali a founding member of the Detroit National Annual WDM Muslim Convention (DNA) and the convener of the "Above Ground Emancipation Movement (AGEM), which is a nationwide collaborative initiative to develop, implement and replicate a communal system of care to impact the mental and spiritual healing of Black people in this country.
